while 2nd–12th graders were on the 436 campus.





ATHLETIC COMPLEX

The Geneva community donated \$6 million to complete the *Eric Liddell Athletic Complex*, named in honor of the former Olympian and Christian missionary. The complex includes state-of-the-art track, soccer fields, baseball field, softball field, batting cages, eight tennis courts, and three beach volleyball courts.

Movement in G Campaign—Phase II UPPER SCHOOL

The Geneva community donated \$7 million to build the upper school building, *Ingram Hall*, named in honor of founder, former board chairman, and long-time head of school Bob Ingram and his wife, Marjean. Building began in June 2018 and is currently where 7th–12th graders learn, study, and gather.

GATHERING TOGETHER

The *Gather* campaign included three transformational capital projects culminating in bringing the whole Geneva community together on one campus so that all Knights can do life together and experience the mission in larger and more conducive spaces.

Ultimately, the cost of this phase of capital improvements is \$25 million.

After the sale of the former campus on 436 and \$18 million in donations from the Geneva community, the amount needed to complete this phase is \$1 million. Geneva is fortunate to have built up enough cash reserves to ensure this phase's completion. However, in order to maintain a strong financial position, it is of utmost importance to repay the reserves by December 2023 through additional gifts and pledges.

LOWER SCHOOL

The 53,000-square-foot building is home to K4–6th graders until such a time when gradual enrollment growth will warrant an additional building for the 6th–8th grade dialectic program. There are two science labs, two art rooms, two music rooms, one enchanting library, a da Vinci room, a Kinder Corners Imagination room, six quiet study/tutoring rooms, thirty-one classrooms, offices, workrooms, meeting spaces, and concessions. The outdoor back porch dining area and playground are most certainly going to be places full of laughter, song, and learning.

COMPETITION GYMNASIUM

Riley Arena, named in honor of TGS Board Chairman John Riley and his wife, Laura, parents of two graduates, will host generations of Geneva athletes for games and matches as well as the whole community for school-wide gatherings. The bleachers will eventually hold 1,200 guests. This space boasts four locker rooms complete with shower facilities, a strength and conditioning weight room, a physical therapy room, a multi-purpose room, two storage rooms, two athletic offices, an outdoor basketball court, and a smaller practice field for lower school use. Additional parking near fields and increased storage space in the outdoor concession building were necessary to accommodate the needs of the expanding athletic program.

ENTRANCE

ADDITIONAL LAND

Neighbors of The Geneva School offered for exclusive sale to the school four acres adjacent to the campus on the north side near the track, with half of the lot being buildable land. The seller stipulated closing by the end of 2022. Offers of adjacent land will be far and few between, so after performing due diligence and confirming its benefit to the overall master plan, the school purchased the land. Only minimal improvements (razing the structure on it and adding a fence) will be made until the land's highest and best use is determined.

THE COST OF THE LAND AND CURRENT SCOPE IS \$500,000.
