THE GENEVA SCHOOL STUDENT DRESS CODE

In the pages that follow, you will find important information about Geneva's dress code for students. This includes information about the school's uniform requirements for regular and chapel days as well as requirements for special events such as field trips. The code also includes information about matters such as length and color of hair, appropriate style and color of shoes, and approved jewelry and accessories for girls.

Most private schools have a dress code. And most private schools experience conflict with students over the dress code. This is not too dissimilar to the conflicts parents may have in determining what their child can and cannot wear. These conflicts often arise from children having rules and expectations placed on them that they have little say in creating and that feel stifling and burdensome. And yet most children eagerly wear with pride the uniform of their favorite sports team or the team on which they have earned a place.

In the same way, we hope each Geneva student values being a member of our student body and wears the school's uniform with pride. Being a Geneva student is a privilege. As such, we expect our students to know the uniform guidelines and attend to their dress each day so our faculty and staff don't have to. This keeps our teachers from having to be the "police" and thus allows the student-teacher relationship to flourish.

We recognize that the requirements of a school dress code go against the preferences of many students who desire freedom to wear what they want in order to express themselves through their dress. While we acknowledge this reality, we also embrace the role that a uniform code of dress provides in helping students become part of a larger entity, the student body of their school. The dress code, when approached properly, can go a long way toward helping students see the virtue of self-denial for the sake of a larger good. Uniforms require a day-in and day-out commitment to a set of requirements that at times may be unwelcome or burdensome. In working through these struggles, children can move in the direction of maturity and even wisdom.

DRESS CODE GUIDELINES

GENERAL GUIDELINES

Students must dress in accordance with their biological sex.

Uniforms, sized appropriately for the wearer, must appear clean and be free of tears and holes upon arrival at school.

Skirt, skort, and optional-day dress lengths should be fingertip length or longer.

In order to maintain consistency of color and style, all uniform items except socks, tights, belts, and shoes must be purchased from TGS uniform suppliers or our used-uniform store. The school's uniform suppliers are Lands' End and Tommy Hilfiger. Refer to the [Uniform Suppliers](#) page on the school's website for information on how to order.

Unless stated otherwise, students are required to be in the proper uniform for that day (i.e., regular or chapel uniform). On occasions such as spirit days or for events such as field trips, modified uniform guidelines will be communicated.

Uniform items should be labeled with the student's name. Items left unclaimed at the end of each day will be placed in lost and found in your child's building. Items remaining in lost and found are donated to Geneva's used-uniform store or given to charity at the end of each quarter.

The program directors are the final arbiters of whether a student is in compliance with the dress code.

GUIDELINES FOR NON CLOTHING ITEMS (HAIR, ACCESSORIES, ETC.)

Hair must be neat, clean, and groomed so students' eyes and faces are visible at all times.

If a student's hair is dyed, it must be a natural color and not include add-ons (such as fairy hair) or unnatural colored braids.

Students are not allowed extreme styles such as Mohawks or designs shaved into the hair.

Boys are not allowed ponytails, buns, or hair accessories, and hair must be above the collar.

Girls may wear earrings but may not have any other visible piercings.

Boys and girls may wear jewelry (necklaces, bracelets, etc.) as long as it is simple, appropriate to the overall dress, and not distracting or excessive. Choker-style necklaces are not permitted.

Boys must be clean-shaven and may not have earrings or other piercings.

Makeup (if worn and only permitted for girls) should be simple and tasteful.

Girls may wear flat headbands, bows, and ribbons.

Hats are not permitted in classrooms or in buildings on campus during school hours.

Students may wear watches as long as they do not make any noises. Smartwatches are not allowed during school hours.

Visible tattoos are not permitted.

DRESS FOR EVERY DAY EXCEPT CHAPEL (K4-6TH)

TGS monogrammed long- or short-sleeve polo shirt (navy, white, or red)

Shorts (in navy or khaki; 3rd-6th grade have the option to wear a brown or black belt with shorts)

Pants (in navy or khaki; 3rd-6th grade have the option to wear a brown or black belt with pants)

DRESS FOR CHAPEL (K-6TH)

Shorts or pants (in navy; 3rd-6th grade have the option to wear a brown or black belt with shorts or pants)

TGS monogrammed long- or short-sleeve polo shirt (in white)

OUTERWEAR

TGS monogrammed sweater/cardigan/fleece (in navy, red, or gray)

TGS branded sweatshirt from TGS store

Appropriately sized and fitted shirts may be worn untucked.

A long-sleeved shirt (plain, solid colored with no hood) may be worn underneath a short-sleeved uniform polo if it is plain white or if it matches the uniform polo color.

Leggings should not be worn underneath shorts. On days that it is too cold to wear shorts, students should wear pants.

Sixth graders may wear the dialectic uniform as an option in the spring semester.

While in class and the hallways, lower school students may wear any Geneva branded outerwear from the school store or uniform outerwear from Lands' End or Tommy Hilfiger. Please note that for the 2026-2027 school year, students may wear uniform outerwear from Lands' End or Tommy Hilfiger or the official lower school uniform sweatshirt (coming soon) sold from the school store. Sweatshirts must be appropriately sized (sleeve length and overall fit).

GUIDELINES FOR SHOES

Lower school students need time to run and play; we are pleased that the schedule allows a lot of time each day for moving around and physical activity. All lower school students should wear shoes with rubber soles so that they can play more freely outside, on the playground, in the gym, and during PE with less risk of injury and less damage to the floors. Tennis shoes/sneakers (including high-top for ankle support), saddle shoes with rubber soles, and Mary Janes with rubber soles are acceptable. Shoes that do not meet the uniform requirements include boots, sandals, crocs, slipper-style or UGG shoes, and light-up shoes.

GUIDELINES FOR SOCKS

Solid colored socks in white, black, or navy blue (brand logos are fine) in crew (mid-calf), ankle (quarter), and no show. No over the calf, knee high, or over the knee socks, or socks with decorative fabrics or colors.

DRESS FOR SPIRIT FRIDAYS (EVERY FRIDAY)

Any Geneva top (e.g., TGS polo, team or club shirt or sweater, or TGS shirt or sweatshirt purchased through the school store) may be worn with uniform shorts or pants.

Appropriately sized and fitted shirts may be worn untucked.

Girls in grades K4–2nd grade should wear blue bike shorts under their dresses.

A long-sleeved shirt (plain, solid colored with no hood) may be worn underneath a short-sleeved uniform polo if it is plain white or if it matches the uniform polo color.

Leggings should not be worn underneath shorts. On days that it is too cold to wear shorts, students should wear pants. Girls may also wear black or navy blue leggings/tights under skirts/skorts/dresses.

Sixth graders may wear the dialectic uniform as an option in the spring semester.

While in class and the hallways, lower school students may wear any Geneva branded outerwear from the school store or uniform outerwear from Lands, End or Tommy Hilfiger. Please note that for the 2026–2027 school year, students may wear uniform outerwear from Lands' End or Tommy Hilfiger or the official lower school uniform sweatshirt (coming soon) sold from the school store. Sweatshirts must be appropriately sized (sleeve length and overall fit).

Shoes that are not permitted include flip-flops, Crocs, slides, slippers, high heels over 2", and shoes with inappropriate graphics.

- TGS branded outerwear purchased from the school store or that represents specific TGS sports teams, clubs, or houses.

Appropriately sized and fitted polo shirts may be worn untucked.

Oxford shirts must be tucked in at all times, buttoned to the second-from-the-top button, and collar buttons buttoned down.

If an undershirt is worn, it must be white. Students must wear a school polo or Oxford shirt beneath any school sweater.

Girls may wear black or navy solid-colored leggings/tights (no patterns) underneath their skort or skirt.

Students must wear a school polo or Oxford shirt beneath any school sweater.

Girls may wear white, black, or navy solid-colored leggings/tights underneath their skort, skirt, or dress.

UNIFORM CODE VIOLATIONS

There will be times when students fail to follow the uniform guidelines. When these occur, the school is here to help get the student back on track through a gentle reminder to the first-time offender, a rebuke for the perpetually forgetful, or a firm reprimand to the willfully disobedient. How this is carried out at different grade levels is explained below. In each action, we expect the student to take ownership of his or her behavior and return the next day in compliance with the guidelines.

Common ways in which students fail to conform to the guidelines include the following:

- **Boys:** Keeping their Oxford shirts tucked in; forgetting either a belt or tie or both; hair length; shaving
- **Girls:** Improper hair accessories or jewelry; Skirt, skort, or optional-day dress lengths shorter than fingertip length
- **Both:** Improper shoes; improper sweater or fleece

If a student in K4–6th grade comes to school out of uniform, the teacher and/or directors for the lower school will address the situation on a case-by-case basis. Options for remediation include forgiving the infraction if it is the first time, providing the student with the correct uniform piece from the school’s used-uniform store, or contacting the parent to bring the correct uniform items to the school.

If a student in 7th–12th grade comes to school out of uniform, then the student will be directed to the dean of students for a “red card” (students carry it with them so that they don’t get dinged for the same offense more than once on the same day) and for their consequences. These may include ignoring the infraction if it is the first time or having the student contact the parent to have the appropriate article brought to school as soon as possible. The uniform infraction will be entered into FACTS by a school administrator. Repeated uniform code violations will result in demerits and, when enough accrue, detentions.

It is important to note that a student who continually and willfully ignores or fights against the school’s uniform guidelines is indicating he or she does not want to attend Geneva. Such actions warrant a hard but necessary conversation between school administration and the student and parents.
